Problem 1. Convert each of the following expressions to its Julia equivalent:

a. $\sin^{-1}(4x/2\pi)$.

$$\text{asin}(4x/2\pi)$$

$$\text{asin}((4*x)/(2*\pi))$$

b. $5x^{y-7z^{40}}$

$$5x^(y-7z^{40})$$

c. $\frac{x}{\frac{z}{y} - 3}$

$$x/(z/y - 3)$$

d. $\frac{|x|}{\arcsin^2 x} + \frac{5e^{\sqrt{x}}}{\pi}$

$$\text{abs}(x)/\text{asin}(x)^2 + 5\text{exp(sqrt}(x))/\pi$$

c. $\frac{4x^6}{\sqrt[3]{x+7}}$

$$4x^6/\text{cbrt}(x+7)$$

$$4x^6/(x+7)^(1/3)$$

Problem 2. Convert the following Julia expressions to standard mathematical expressions. Use parentheses to clearly indicate the order of operations:

a. x^y^z

$$x^{y^z}$$

b. $\sin(x)^3/5*\sqrt{x}$

$$\frac{\sin^3(x)}{5} \cdot \sqrt{x}$$

c. $\exp(x+z)/x-y$

$$\frac{e^{x+z}}{x} - y$$

d. $x-z/(y+x)*(z-x)$

$$x - \frac{z}{y+x} (z-x)$$

e. $6.3e-45$

$$6.3 \cdot 10^{-45}$$
